**Graduation dates:** This report includes information on graduates completing degrees in August of 2008, December of 2008, and May of 2009.

**Survey method and schedule.** The survey was conducted four times. The first survey was distributed when students picked up their cap and gown for graduation. Graduates were surveyed by first-class mail to the latest known home address in November 2008 and March 2009. The students that were still missing information were called and/or sent a Facebook message in April and May 2009.

This year's undergraduate and graduate combined survey response rate was 43.2% (undergraduate survey response rate was 53%). This is our third year of having a response rate higher than forty percent. This increase can be attributed to collecting surveys when students pick up their cap and gowns and increased success making phone calls.

### REPORT RELIABILITY

The following two conditions relating to students completing the survey affect the reliability of this report: **(1)** *We are more likely to receive surveys from employed graduates.* We expect that students who don't have employment will not respond to the survey. (To further assist unemployed students, we included information about our specific employment related services with the mailed survey). **(2)** *The survey is more likely to be returned from unemployed graduates living at home.* We mail surveys to the home address on file. Employed graduates are more likely to have moved away from home and we do not have their forwarding addresses.

We cannot determine the influence of these conditions on this survey. We hope that they balance out, give us an accurate picture and cancel out any skewed data.

### STATISTICAL BASE

The "number of graduates" for each major may not include some who graduated late (incomplete grades, etc.). Graduates are counted in their first major only, with the exception of teachers. Also, we summarize teachers as a group. All returns, large or small, are included to keep the format consistent. (We realize that percentages are of limited value where the respondent base is small).

### DISTRIBUTION OF SURVEY RESPONSES

The original survey returns are sent to the Alumni Office after this report is completed for use in updating their records.

## SUMMARY OF SERVICES FOR 2008-2009 YEAR

### **Personnel**

- Career Planning professional staff for the 2008-2009 academic year were Karen Ham, Director; Margaret Bain, Assistant Director; Erin Kerwin, Counselor; and Bonnie Marsh-Godreau, Secretary.
- Our student workers included: Eric Hotchkiss, Dawn Perry, Scott Reiber, Bridget Barr, Amanda Wohlberg, Robert Leabo, Tahirih Lopez, Nicole Enos and Alison Chiasson.

### **Department Presentations/Events/Appointments/Committees**

- In addition to regular student services, the following presentations were completed this year: classroom -52, on campus non-classroom -37, special career planning campus events -11.
- We served on 18 different committees.
- We provided 994 individual services and presented to 2,017 students in group settings, providing them with 4,253 services in 13 different categories.
- Of the students helped through individual sessions, 39% were seniors, 12% were juniors, 9% were sophomores, 4% were freshmen, 15% were graduate students, 17% were alumni, and 4% were community members.
- Of the students seen in workshops/presentations, 31% were seniors, 27% were juniors, 16% were sophomores, 20% were freshmen, and 6% were graduate students, 0% were alumni, .01% were community members.

### **Employers (Excluding Job Fair)**

- Five hundred forty-nine positions were posted with our office.
- Sixty-eight resume packets were mailed to employers.
- Twenty-nine special flyers were created to advertise employer career events or local jobs
- Thirteen employers scheduled on-campus visits.
- Presentations of our services were given personally to 102 employers.

### **Teacher Recruitment Days**

- This event was co-administered by 15 higher education institutions located in central New York.
- Sixty-three school systems and nearly 780 students attended this event.
- Seventy-six SUNY Potsdam students registered. Sixty of these students attended and participated in over 150 interviews.

### **Major Affair Program**

- We co-administered this program with the Center for Campus Life and Alumni Offices. We directed this program towards freshmen and undeclared students.
- Every academic department was represented and 468 students attended. This was a 9% increase over last year's student attendance. It was the highest attendance record for the sixteen years that we have administered this program!
- Eighty percent of the students attending the event completed an evaluation. Of the students completing an evaluation, forty-seven percent of the students stated that they learned about majors aside from their current major, thirty-eight percent of the students found out how majors related to a career, thirty percent of the students learned information that would help them select a major, and 6 % of the students obtained information about other majors because they were considering changing their major.

### **Graduate and Professional School Day**

- This is the first year that we planned and implemented a campus Graduate and Professional School Day.
- We consulted with St. Lawrence University and agreed to have our Graduate and Professional School Day at different times on the same date, in hopes of increasing attendance by graduate school representatives at both events.
- Thirty-eight universities and 283 students attended this event.
- Our event survey evaluations received high accolades from the graduate school representatives and the students who attended.

### **Undeclared Sophomores**

- We sent a mass email to all undeclared sophomores informing each how Career Planning can help them decide on a major. The email also informed the students that they would be sent an appointment card in their campus mailboxes.
- After looking up each student's academic schedule, we scheduled a thirty-minute appointment with one of our professional staff, and then mailed their appointment information to their campus mailbox.
- We scheduled 149 undeclared sophomore student appointments. We met with 43 of those students and spoke with 15 who told us they were already declared or were transferring to another institution.
- During their appointment, we went over the process of declaring a major, our self-assessment services, allowed them to browse our career library, and assisted them in any way possible with their major/career selection.

### **SUNY Potsdam Job Fair**

- Career Planning, Experiential Education, and Alumni Offices hosted a Job Fair on campus on April 8, 2009 for the first time since 2003.
- Recruiters and students were looking to fill full-time, part-time, internship, summer, and volunteer opportunities.
- Fifty-seven recruiters representing 34 organizations attended.
- One hundred and seventy students/alumni filled the Multi-Purpose Room. Employers were pleased with the overall organization of the event, with student resumes, and with our facility.
- Overall, students found the fair to be helpful and well organized.

### **Grad Finale**

- This year we co-designed and implemented a Grad Finale program with ten other campus departments and Jostens. The purpose of the program was to assist seniors and graduate students with their transition from college.
- The program was very well received by everyone.
- The Career Planning Office collected 341 graduate surveys at this program.

### **Computer Services**

- FOCUS and SIGI are interactive computer career selection systems that were used by 313 students 599 times.
- Career Planning Web Page continues to be highly utilized.  
We spent many hours with the Content Management Director converting our data to the new content management system.
- Student computers were used by students to produce resumes, portfolios, business cards, cover letters, job search and to access the Career Planning Web Page.

### **College Committees**

- Karen served as the Student Affairs Representative for the Faculty Senate and a Faculty Advisor for Circle K, Campus Representative for the Potsdam Holiday Fund and on the CSTEP Advisory Board.
- Meg chaired a BearTracker Committee. Erin, Karen and Bonnie served on this committee.
- Erin and Karen served on the Teacher Recruitment Days Committee.
- Karen served on the TRD Student Software Sub-Committee.
- Karen served as a member of Student Data General Education, Grad Finale, and “A Major Affair.” Committees.
- Karen served on the SUNY CDO Programming Committee and the SUNY CDO Director’s Group. Erin served on the SUNY CDO Conference Planning Committee.
- Meg served on the Sustainability Committee.
- Erin served as a mentor and advisor for the AST Sorority.
- Meg and Erin served on the EEO Scholarship Committee.
- Meg chaired the Job Expo Committee.

### **Community Outreach**

- We held forty-two career counseling appointments with community members.
- We presented at local area career programs.
- We served on board of directors for local organizations and assisted with community fundraisers.

- To continue to integrate the use of technology for student and office services. The challenge is to stay abreast of technological changes in the career planning field and having the funds to keep resources available and current.
- To integrate Learning Outcome Assessment into our services and programs. The challenge is gaining the knowledge to effectively accomplish this.
