Do Re Sol

Do, Re & Sol are the Solfege syllables for scale degrees 1, 2 and 5 in the major and minor scales. As a pitch aggregate, Do, Re & Sol is neutral in nature, suggesting neither major nor minor tonalities. The listener perceives tonality via context (foreign bass tones, secondary melodic material). Do, Re & Sol are used both horizontally (melodic material) and vertically (chordal material). Do Re Sol was written for and premiered by The Crane Jazz Ensemble at the 2009 NYSSMA Winter Conference.

<u>Sonic Variables: Vol.1</u> <u>The Track Suite</u>

This project took its first steps back in 2017 right after the main theme, *Track 7*, was composed and premiered. *Track 1: Prologue* starts as the beginning, the birth of a bright and bouncing motif, an idea waiting to be expanded. *Track 2: Aerodynamics* introduces happiness and child-like innocence. Conflict ensues with *Track 3: Harmonics* and, as the tension rises in the piece, reality rips itself apart and the motif descends into the deep, well-hidden depression that is *Track 4: Chordscape*. The motif shows a different face, *Track 5: Phenomenology*, that the rest of the world sees. It can only keep up the charade for so long before it eventually must face its problems, the eventuality that is *Track 6: Chronology*. As everything comes full circle, the motif fully develops its identity. It has found itself; it is no longer the naïve entity that it once was. It has developed the serenity to accept the things it can't change, the courage to change the things that it can, and the wisdom to know the difference. A hope for the future is conveyed in *Track 7: Denouement*.

Sonic *Variables* is a three-part musical representation of my odyssey. I would never have guessed that music would take me to a multitude of interesting and wonderful places when I started down this path. It is the culmination of life, faith, love, pain, and sacrifice that has produced this first set of pieces collectively entitled *The Track Suite*.
