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NOTES:

¹ Piano, harp and guitar students will automatically begin their degrees in the general music track. Other students may switch to the orchestra track with approval as described in the Crane Student Handbook (in section VII). For the most part, the coursework for all students in the general music track will be the same, as is listed here. However, students for whom piano is their primary instrument will not take the listed functional keyboard courses (MUCB 101 & 102, MUCC 201 & 202) but instead take MUCC 303 in the spring of their sophomore year, and voice students do not need to take MUCC 350 Vocal Tech. Ensemble requirements will also vary depending on the student's instrument; see page 3 of this document.

² These courses can be taken either semester listed, but *must* be taken in one of the semesters indicated in order to complete the degree requirements in the prescribed time.

³ See page 4 for detailed information, but the required non-music courses (aside from FW and FM) are:

- Two General Education courses that must be taken outside of music (a Science and an XC course),
- a non-music liberal arts elective (2 credits minimum), and
- the three non-music courses required for certification:
 - o PSYC 220 Child Development (also counts as SA)
 - o EDLS 307 Literacy Education in the Arts
 - o HLTH 230 School Health (also counts as one PE/HW)

- 3 credit Upper-Division Music Education (MUCE) elective,
- 3 credit Upper-Division Music Theory or Music History (MUCH or MUCT) elective, and
- 3 credits of free music electives (limit of one ensemble per semester can count towards this requirement)

"Upper-Division" means the course number must be at least 300 (typically a 3XX or 4XX course, although students may take 5XX courses as undergraduates as well).

Students must complete the required number of credits within each Gen Ed designation. No more than eight General Education credits can come from the same department. AE, AC and HI requirements are fulfilled through required music courses; all other Modes of Inquiry must be fulfilled with non-music courses. All courses receive LA credit unless the course title has an "@" in front of it in the Schedule of Classes.

AE - Aesthetic-Experiential (2 cr) – satisfied by ensemble requirements
AC - Aesthetic-Critical (3 cr) – satisfied by MUCB 323 Music History III
HI – Historical Inquiry (3 cr) - satisfied by MUCB 202 Music History II

Modern Language Proficiency:

ML - Students must complete through the equivalent of 103-level. See Undergraduate Catalog for more information. Credits for ML courses count as LA electives.

Physical Education/Health Requirement: (credits vary)

PE - Students must complete 2 *courses* with PE or HW designation. For Music Education majors, HLTH 230 School Health fulfills one of these requirements.

Non-Music Liberal Arts Electives: (8 cr)

These courses cannot have an "@" in front of the title in the Schedule of Classes. Music Education *must* elect EDLS 307 Literacy in the Arts (3 cr) and HLTH 230 School Health (3 cr), leaving only 2 credits of non-music LA electives to fill. As noted above, any Modern Language courses taken will count in this category.
