 - Judy indicated very few proposals have been submitted the past three years for the mini grants
 - Judy said that the purpose of assessment is to improve assessment and student learning outcome achievement in areas that departments are struggling in
 - CAAC Assessment Mini Grant Committee brainstormed possible ways to increase proposals -- considering changing the deadline, possible course release, support and assistance from the OIE office to meet with departments as they write the grant, execute the grant, etc.
 - Blair Madore suggested that we think like faculty when creating a deadline not to have deadline at the end of the semester when faculty are extremely busy

- ➤ Larry Brehm indicated that his department could use the money to do field testing—Bruce and Judy suggested he submit a proposal
- ➤ Kathy Jeror suggested to have the initial deadline be end of September but remain open until end of the semester until all grants have been allocated

 - Glenda stated that we still want to have a department incentive open to suggestions
 - We would like to increase the usage of NSSE data -- will be posting more statistical reports versus just summary presentations;
 - ➤ Glenda also indicated the desire to hold focus groups with students regarding the NSSE results (i.e. sophomore focus groups with students who completed the NSSE the prior year)
 - ➤ Glenda also discussed the option/opportunity for classes that do data analysis/survey projects to take advantage of the large amount of data already available (NSSE data starting from 2003) and perhaps have student-led focus groups
