Conductor



Brian K. Doyle joined the Crane School of Music faculty as Director of Bands in 2006. He conducts the Crane Wind Ensemble (CWE) and Symphonic Band, and also teaches courses in conducting. A Michigan native, he received all of his degrees in his home state. Doyle graduated from Michigan State University with a BME and two MM degrees (saxophone and wind conducting). His principal teachers included John Whitwell, Joseph Lulloff and James Forger. Doyle later received the AMusD in Wind Conducting under the mentorship of Michael Haithcock at the University of Michigan.

Prior to completing his undergraduate degree in Music Education, Doyle served for two years in the United States Air Force as a saxophonist in the 745th Air Force Band stationed at Barksdale AFB, Louisiana. Returning to Michigan State University, Doyle was

a member of the award-winning Borealis Saxophone Quartet, taking top honors at the Coleman, Carmel, and Fischoff Chamber Music competitions in the early 1990s. At that time, he also performed in ensembles backing touring musicians such as Bob Hope, Bernadette Peters, Mel Torme, Jeffrey Osborne, Roberta Flack, and Tommy Tune. Additionally, as an active member of the mid-Michigan music scene, Doyle performed in several big bands as well as the salsa band, Orquesta Tradicion Latina.

Dr. Doyle's former teaching posts include faculty positions at Indiana University, The University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill, Duke University, and as a grades 5-12 public school music educator in Imlay City, MI. While in North Carolina, Dr. Doyle served as the resident conductor of the Triangle British Brass Band and performed regularly as saxophonist with the North Carolina Symphony Orchestra, Gerhardt Zimmermann, music director. For ten summers, Dr. Doyle conducted ensembles at the renowned Interlochen Arts Camp, and for one summer at the New England Music Camp. Dr. Doyle now spends his summers as the conductor of the Crane Youth Music Wind Ensemble.

Active in his support of bands in the public schools, Dr. Doyle is a member of the New York State Band Directors Association (NYSBDA), initially elected to the Executive Board as Member At-Large, then serving as 1st Vice President and President. He is now involved as NSYBDA's Commissioning Project Chair.

Students in the Crane Bands consistently receive opportunities to engage with leaders in the profession, and with the music and composers of our time. Recent guests include John Whitwell, Michael Haithcock, Frank Battisti, and Gunther Schuller. The CWE performs at least two consortium or world premieres annually, including works by Steven Bryant, Roshanne Etezady, David Heinick, Kristin Kuster, Andre Previn, Joel Puckett, D.J Sparr, and Gregory Wanamaker. Composers in residence include Gunther Schuller, Dan Welcher, Joel Puckett, Roshanne Etezady, Kristin Kuster and Stacy Garrop.

Dr. Doyle is active in New England and the Atlantic States as a guest conductor and clinician, conducting All-State ensembles in New York, Maine, and North Carolina. In addition to educational organizations, he is a member of CBDNA, WASBE (World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles), and the prestigious American Bandmasters Association (ABA).

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History

Founded in 1998, Northern Symphonic Winds is a 55-piece wind and percussion ensemble comprised of faculty from The Crane School of Music, northern New York music teachers and other professionals, and selected Crane students. First convened by Tim Topolewski and Scott LaVine in January 1999 as "The Celebration Winds," the ensemble honored Crane faculty composer Robert Washburn on the occasion of his 70th birthday year with a concert of his works. In October 1999, the ensemble re-organized under the name Northern Symphonic Winds.

The ensemble holds firmly to three primary objectives: to bring together and feature the finest wind and percussion performers available in the North Country; to perform music of the highest quality; to bring enjoyment and satisfaction not just to the ensemble's musicians, but also to audiences around the North Country. NSW is committed to the North Country community, donating concert proceeds to worthy causes and hosting benefits for local charitable organizations. Recent donated proceeds have included the hurricane relief fund in Mississippi, the Crane School of Music organ restoration project, the Potsdam Animal Shelter, Potsdam Fire Department, and Canton-Potsdam Hospitals.

In 2003, NSW was the featured ensemble at the 22nd Annual Symposium of the New York State Band Directors Association (NYSBDA) in Syracuse. In 2009, the ensemble was featured at the 74th Annual Winter Conference of the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA) in Rochester.


