Additional Courses Outside of Music

Students will need to take approximately 45 additional credits of non-music courses. The exact number will depend on the exact courses taken to fulfill the Pathways requirements. The total minimum number of non-music credits required for this degree is 70.

The total minimum number of liberal arts credits required for this degree is 90. Likely all or nearly all of the 70 credits of non-music courses will be liberal arts classes. There are about 24 liberal arts credits of music courses in the degree, so in most cases, fulfillment of the 70 credits outside of music degree requirement will fulfill the 90 LA credits requirement.
