Additionally, students for whom piano is their primary instrument do not take Keyboard I and II (MUCC 111 & 112), nor do they take the additional year of keyboard courses, but instead take MUCC 303 in the spring of sophomore or junior year (it is offered in odd-year spring semesters); piano students must also take MUCP 343 Art of Accompanying *or* MUCP 430 Art Song Repertoire as part of their ensemble requirements (see page 3).
