
Requirements for Functional Keyboard I (MUCC 201)- Sophomore year, Fall semester

1. Chord Progression—I IV I V V^7 I IV V^7 I (i iv i V V^7 i iv V^7 i) chord progression in major and minor keys up to four sharps and flats using left hand root tones and right hand closest position chords from first inversion tonic. Proper fingering is required, quarter note=66.


2. Sing and Play Vocalise— Right hand scale patterns and left hand chords, ascending and descending by half step without pausing, sing while playing. Quarter note=104.
