BI Training

Business Intelligence Basic Training will be offered on March 15th at 2pm. This training is intended for new users of finance dashboards, but any finance user is welcome to attend. This training will cover the basics of how to use a dashboard and manipulate a report layout on a BI finance dashboard. The training will touch on Account Summary, Transaction Inquiry, and Reference Dashboards but these skills can be applied to any BI dashboard.
