Group Tutoring

With Progress Surveys being completed in the next couple of weeks, each **Tutoring Referral** submitted will initiate both a text and an email to the student to connect them with support services. Students & Faculty at ACDA Conference

During spring break, 8 students travelled with faculty members, Kerri Canedy and Robin Collen to the <u>American College Dance Association Conference--Mid-Atlantic North Region</u> at Mercyhurst University in Erie, PA. They took and taught classes and watched performances. MacKenzie Moonie and Camryn Douglas, both seniors double-majoring in Dance and Arts Management presented their work. MacKenzie taught a class based on her research of dancer Anna Halprin. Camryn's quintet, *Serenity*, was performed for attendees, including 3 choreographer/adjudicators, from whom she received feedback. Camryn's work was recognized for its artistry by being selected by the adjudicators to be performed again, with a selected group of dance works, in the gala concert at the conclusion of the conference.

Wenner Gren Award

The prestigious Wenner Gren Foundation has awarded \$17,000 to Sergio López and Lydia Rodríguez to fund the 9th AIBR International Conference of Anthropology, which this year will take place in Mexico City in August 8-11. Since 2016, this conference has hosted several SUNY Potsdam students who completed a 3-credit internship. Some of the funds awarded by the Wenner Gren Foundation have been used to support the travel of SUNY Potsdam interns to different venues where the conference has been held, like Spain or Mexico. This international meeting brings together over 600 anthropology professionals and students from all over the world.
