Step 6	Under COMPOSER , enter the composer's name. Under their name, enter birth year or birth and death years. An en dash (–) with no space should be used between the birth and death dates.				

	On an Apple computer, create using <option> plus "hyphen;' on a Windows computer, create using plus "hyphen" on the number pad, or using plus the numbers 0150 on the right-side number pad.</option>

Step 7	If there are any additional performers, add their names to the ADDITIONAL PERFORMER FULL NAME, INSTRUMENT row. If there are no additional performers, delete the row.
Note	If the work is a premiere, add World Premiere in its own row.

Note	If there is an <i>Intermission</i> or <i>Brief Pause</i> , add it between two empty rows centered (merging the two columns). If this is not needed, delete row.
Step 8	Repeat steps 5 – 7 for all works being performed.
Step 9	Once you have finished entering all of the performed works, delete any unnecessary rows. If you need addition rows, add them as needed.
Step 10	Enter your full name and studio instructor under FULL NAME is from the studio of STUDIO INSTRUCTOR FULL NAME.
Step 11	Performance majors (undergraduate and graduate) and students performing a 60-Minute Recital for the Performers Certificate are required to have one of the following statements at the end of their recital programs. This is a merged row after the studio instructor aknowledgement (step 10).

Bachelor of Music in Performance Students performing a 30-Minute Recital	This program is presented to fulfill the junior recital requirement for the Bachelor of Music degree in Performance.
Bachelor of Music in Performance Students performing a 60-Minute Recital	This program is presented to fulfill the senior recital requirement for the Bachelor of Music degree in Performance.
Master of Music in Performance Students perofrming a 60- or 90- Minute Recital	This program is presented to fulfill the graduate recital requirement for the Master of Music degree in Performance.
Students performing a 60-Minute Recital for the Performer's Certificate	This is an hour recital for completion of the Performance Certificate.
