<u>Librarian</u> Ashley Berrell **Ronald Berry** retired from his career as a licensed civil engineer in 2006 and revisited the trumpet of his youth, playing in a small community band in St. Regis Falls. He soon realized that there were too for many trumpets for that small band, and slowly descended to low brass, finding home on the tuba. In a discussion with Dr. Chuck Guy, Ron learned about "Adult Band Camps" and that the New Horizons Music organization sponsors such camps. The New Horizons program focuses on retired adults returning to the instruments of their youth or learning a new instrument. After attending 3 camps in 2 years, Ron knew that he had to share this joy with Potsdam and set about to form the New Horizons Band of Northern New York. With the aid of Dr. Michael Schaff, the band found a home in Crane in 2009, complete with lessons by the Music Education Practicum students. Along the way, Ron studied conducting with Dr. James Madeja. Now we, a group of over 50 adults, have completed 10 years of making music together in a concert band and a swing band.

Ron has remained devoted to the work and vision of the New Horizons International Music Association by serving on its Board of Directors and is the current President of the Board.

Will Sutton is an avid teacher and performer of euphonium, tuba, and trombone. He has held teaching positions at Olivet College, Saginaw Valley State University, The Flint Institute of Music, and The Michigan State University Community Music School. As a performer, Dr. Sutton's experience spans a wide range of musical styles and genres. He has performed with the Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra, Lansing Symphony Orchestra, Capital City Brass Band, Mountain Town Brass Band, Mid-Michigan Brass Band, Capital Region Wind Ensemble, Orchestra of Northern New York, Northern Symphonic Winds, and Joey Thomas Big Band. Dr. Sutton has performed as a soloist with groups such as the Olivet College Wind Ensemble, Saginaw Valley State University Wind Ensemble, and Mid-Michigan Brass Band to name a few. He has also been invited to perform at conferences such as the Midwest Regional Tuba and Euphonium Conference and International Tuba and Euphonium Conference. Dr. Sutton is a founding member of the Saginaw Valley State University Brass Quintet.

As a competitor, Dr. Sutton received first prize in the Artist Solo Euphonium Competition at the Midwest Regional Tuba and Euphonium Conference. With his tuba and euphonium quartet, Dr. Sutton competed as a semifinalist at the 2016 International Tuba and Euphonium Competition. Dr. Sutton was also a four-time semifinalist in the Artist Euphonium Division of the Leonard Falcone International Euphonium and Tuba Competition and has been a semifinalist multiple times for euphonium vacancies in premiere military bands.

In addition to his experience in large ensemble and solo settings, Dr. Sutton enjoys performing diverse chamber repertoire. He seeks out opportunities to present chamber recitals that utilize alternative venues and incorporate multimedia, recently completing a set of transcriptions arranged to be performed in coordination with text and artwork. Dr. Sutton holds Degrees from Michigan State University, The State University of New York at Potsdam, and Schenectady County Community College. His solo playing can be heard under the Kendor Music, Inc. label. His teachers include Phillip Sinder, Ava Ordman, Charles Guy, Mark Hartman, Michael Wilkinson, and Michael Meidenbauer.
