# Overview of the Tuition Benefits Program

You can reach your education and career goals while saving money on tuition and exam fees. Take advantage of all the tuition benefits program has to offer.

- **Tuition Vouchers** - Use vouchers to help pay for tuition at over 150 participating providers.
- **Tuition Reimbursement** - Get reimbursed for tuition pre-paid to an approved provider following course completion.
- **Statewide Targeted Tuition Benefits** - Save more money on tuition while training in one of five areas identified as high demand in NYS.
- **Credit-by-Exam Fee Reimbursement** - Get repaid for an unlimited number of eligible exams up to a maximum of \$350 per exam.
- **Certification and Licensure Exam Fee Reimbursement** - Get repaid for an unlimited number of eligible certification and licensure exam fees up to a maximum of \$350 per exam.

# Am I Eligible for Tuition Benefits?

You are eligible for tuition benefits if you are a CSEA-represented NYS employee (ASU, ISU, OSU, or DMNA) **receiving a NYS paycheck when applying (application received after first paycheck and before last paycheck)**, or a CSEA-represented NYS employee who has been laid off in the past year and is on a Civil Service Preferred List.

CSEA-represented NYS employees who are otherwise eligible but are on approved non-disciplinary leave without pay or on workers' compensation leave may also qualify with proper documentation. Documentation must specify the type of leave and the start date. It must be signed by a human resources officer and attached to your tuition benefits application form.



## Advisement



Many schools have specific requirements you must meet before registering for a course.

We suggest you get started by contacting the school directly for course information.

You may also contact a Partnership advisor for **general advisement and help applying for and using your tuition benefits**.

Partnership advisors are also available for individual confidential advisement in educational and career planning, alternative approaches to furthering your education, educational financing, and identifying adult education basics courses.

# Course Criteria



Eligible courses must be in session sometime between April 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024.

All courses **must** be vocational, trade, technical, or business-related, instructor-led, and relevant to a NYS occupation or NYS workforce need.

Many providers offer basic skills courses in English, reading, writing, and math, or offer Adult Basic Education, High School Equivalency, and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) courses. These courses are often free, but the Partnership can cover the course if tuition is charged.

## Types of Non-Credit Courses NOT Eligible for Tuition Benefits

The following types of non-credit courses are **not eligible** for tuition benefits.



- Bartending
- Gaming (*for example, billiards and poker*)
- Modeling and appearance enhancement
- Physical education (*for example, kickboxing, karate, martial arts, dance, and Pilates*)
- Reiki, yoga, meditation, and hypnosis
- Starting your own business
- One-on-one courses or tutoring

### Tuition Voucher

**You should apply for this benefit if the school you want to attend is one of our participating providers.** Participating schools have agreed to accept vouchers in place of student payment and will bill the Partnership directly for course tuition. A complete directory of participating providers is included at the back of this catalog.

### Tuition Reimbursement

**You should apply for reimbursement if any of the following are true:**

The school you want to attend is not listed in this catalog.

The school listed in this catalog does not offer a convenient location or the type of course you are interested in.

You have already paid for the course and prefer to be reimbursed directly.

**The school must be recognized as an accredited educational institution.** *Reimbursement will not be provided for coursework taken at a school that is not accredited.*

Please contact us before registering with the school to ensure they are an approved reimbursement provider.

# Credit-by-Exam Fee Reimbursement

## CLEP, DANTES, TECEP, and Excelsior University Exams

In addition to your other tuition benefits, you can get reimbursed for an **unlimited** number of exams, including test center fees up to a maximum of \$350 per exam.

Eligible exams are those available through the College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), DANTES Subject Standardized Test (DSST), Thomas Edison College Examination Program (TECEP), and Excelsior University.

**College-Level Examination Program (CLEP)** - This national credit-by-exam program that allows students to earn credit for what they already know. Exams cover material taught in courses most students take as requirements in the first two years of college. <https://clep.collegeboard.org>.

**DANTES Subject Standardized Test (DSST)** - This credit-by-exam program offers students the opportunity to earn college credit for knowledge gained in the workplace, classroom, or through independent study. The exams cover physical sciences, social sciences, business, applied technology, humanities, and more. [www.getcollegecredit.com](http://www.getcollegecredit.com).

**Thomas Edison College Examination Program (TECEP)** - This program offers a wide range of exams for earning college credit. The exams are designed to allow you to demonstrate the college-level knowledge you have gained through work, independent reading, or other activities. Originally designed to help enrolled Thomas Edison State College students meet degree requirements, the exams are now administered nationally and may be used at many other institutions. **Excelsior University** - These exams provide flexible opportunities to demonstrate college-level learning in the arts and sciences, business, nursing, and education. [www.excelsior.edu](http://www.excelsior.edu).

# Certification and Licensure Exam Fee Reimbursement

In addition to your other tuition benefits, you can get reimbursed for an **unlimited** number of certification or licensure exam fees up to a maximum of \$350 per exam.

**This program is not intended to replace existing agency exam reimbursement programs.**

To be eligible for reimbursement, a certification or licensure exam must meet the following criteria:

1. Be job- or career-related.
2. Lead to certification or licensure for an occupation that currently exists in NYS service.
3. Be administered by an accredited organization.

Examples include Boiler Inspector, Certified Public Accountant, Commercial Pesticide Applicator/Technician, Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor, Dental Hygienist, Licensed Practical Nurse, Physical Therapy Assistant, Registered Nurse, and Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator. Exams for certification in specific software or hardware programs by Microsoft, Novell, Oracle, and others may also be covered.

## **Costs and fees not reimbursed by this program include:**

- Civil Service examination fees.
- Fees for exams leading to certification in a career that does not exist in NYS service.
- Fees for exams leading to college credit for life experience.
- Academic and application fees.
- Study materials (books, CDs, DVDs, etc.) and supplies.
- License and certification renewals.
- Exam fees that are reimbursable by the employee's agency.

**Please Note:** *The IRS considers reimbursements under the Certification and Licensure Exam Fee Reimbursement Program taxable income; applicable income taxes will be withheld from paychecks.*

# Tuition Coverage Limits

The Tuition Benefits Program provides **two standard benefits** (tuition vouchers **OR** tuition reimbursements), **two statewide targeted** tuition benefits, an **unlimited** number of Credit-by-Exam Fee Reimbursement benefits, and an **unlimited** number of Certification and Licensure Exam Fee Reimbursement benefits.

A **single tuition benefit** (voucher or reimbursement) can cover **ONE** of the following:

| *A voucher at a private school will cover the full tuition for an <i>undergraduate course</i> ; however, partial tuition up to \$305 per credit hour is covered for a graduate-level course. |   |   |

**Two tuition benefits** (vouchers or reimbursements) can be combined and used for one non-credit course over \$1,220 (each benefit will cover up to a **maximum** of \$1,220), or for one credit-bearing course that is more than four credits, or for one Excelsior University fee that costs more than \$1,220.

## Apply Today

The application process varies based on the type of benefit sought. Once you've determined the type of benefit you need, and you're ready to apply, follow the steps below.

### For Tuition Vouchers and Reimbursements

- 1. Find an eligible course(s).** Course(s) must be in session at some point between April 1, 2023 and March 31, 2024.
- 2. Complete and return the enclosed application form via mail, fax, or email.** *If sent via U.S. mail, applications must be received (not postmarked) by March 31, 2024.*
  - For Vouchers* - Be sure to enter the correct school code *and* school name using the participating provider directory in this catalog.
  - For Reimbursement* - Be sure to enter "TRP" (Tuition Reimbursement Program) for the school code and include the school's full name. You do not have to complete your course before you apply. However, you will not receive reimbursement until after you complete your course at an accredited provider. Exceptions may apply if courses are more than one year long.
- 3. Expect a response within 10 business days.** If you do not hear from us by this time, please call (800) 253-4332 (*Option 1*) or email [advisors@nyscseapartnership.org](mailto:advisors@nyscseapartnership.org).

# Apply Today

## For Credit-By Exam Fee *and* Certification and Licensing Exam Fee Reimbursement

1. **Contact Us** - Call (800) 253-4332 (*Option 1*) or email [advisors@nyscseapartnership.org](mailto:advisors@nyscseapartnership.org). Be prepared to share the date you took or will take your exam.
2. **Pay and Test** - Pay for and complete the exam and then provide us with proof of payment and exam completion.
3. **Get Reimbursed** - You will be reimbursed pass or fail, after submitting the required documentation.

## Use Your Benefits

### Tuition Voucher

If you receive a voucher for a participating school (schools that accept vouchers), you must:

1. Follow the school's registration instructions and schedule. *If you do not formally register at the school, you may not be allowed to attend the course.*
2. Submit the voucher to the school when you register or pay for your course. By doing so, you permit the school to bill the Partnership. *If you do not submit the voucher to the school, you may be billed by the school.*

### Tuition Reimbursement

**You must complete your course to receive tuition reimbursement.**

If you receive a reimbursement approval, you must:

- Return the completed reimbursement approval form to the Partnership **after** completing and paying for the course. Include a copy of your account statement from the school detailing tuition charges (separate from fees), tuition payment, sources of payments, and a copy of your transcript or grade report indicating course completion.
- Once all required supporting documents are received, we will mail your tuition reimbursement to you within 60 days.

**The deadline to submit documentation for reimbursement is June 30, 2024.** Please contact us at (800) 253-4332 (Option 2), or [reimbursement@nyscseapartnership.org](mailto:reimbursement@nyscseapartnership.org) if you cannot provide the appropriate documentation by this time.

# Changing, Dropping, and Canceling



## Changing Schools or Benefit Type

If you want to attend a school other than the one you were initially approved, or change the benefit type:

- **Return the original approval form by March 31, 2024**, with the “Changing Schools or Benefit Type” section completed on the back of the form. *If you no longer have the original approval form, please contact us.*

Please note that changing schools or benefit type can be approved only if **no charges** were incurred against the original benefit, voucher, or reimbursement approval.

## Changing Courses

Changing a course does not require prior approval from the Partnership if the new course meets our course criteria as outlined in this catalog.

## Dropping Courses

- If you register for a course but withdraw within the school’s 100% refund period (if one is available), the Partnership will **not be** required to pay for your participation in the course and your tuition benefit may still be valid for you to use at that school.
- If you drop your course outside of the school’s 100% refund period, the Partnership will pay the school as required, and **the tuition benefit will be considered used.**

Please contact the provider directly to find out about their drop procedures and refund policy.

## Canceling Benefits

If you are unable to use your tuition benefit during the eligible time frame and want to cancel it, you must:

- **Return the original approval form by March 31, 2024**, with the “Canceling a Tuition Benefit” section completed on the back of the form. *If you no longer have the original approval form, please contact us.*

### ***Please Note:***

- Cancellations can be approved only if no charges were incurred against the **original** benefit, voucher, or reimbursement approval.
- Tuition benefits cannot be carried over from one program year to the next or transferred to another individual.

# Other Financial Aid

You may be eligible for state or federal student financial aid if enrolled in a college degree or certification program. To that end, the following resources may be of interest to you.

## **Aid for Part-Time Study (APTS)**

Students enrolled part-time in approved graduate studies may be eligible for grant assistance through this program. Awards provide up to \$2,000 per year for part-time undergraduate study at participating institutions in New York State. You must be matriculated in an approved program of study, enrolled in 3 to 11 credit hours, and meet eligibility requirements. *Contact your school's financial aid office or visit [www.hesc.ny.gov](http://www.hesc.ny.gov).*

## **Excelsior Scholarship**

In combination with other student financial aid programs, this scholarship can allow students to attend a SUNY or CUNY college tuition-free. *Learn more at [www.hesc.ny.gov](http://www.hesc.ny.gov).*

## **Federal Pell Grant Program**

This is usually awarded to undergraduate students who have not yet earned a bachelor's, graduate, or professional degree. Pell Grants are based on financial need, as demonstrated on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). *Learn more online at [www.studentaid.gov](http://www.studentaid.gov).*

## **Federal Tax Benefits for Education**

If you, your spouse, or a dependent are taking college courses or other post-secondary training, you may benefit from the American Opportunity Credit or the Lifetime Learning Credit. These programs are federal tax credits to help offset the costs of higher education. *Visit [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) for more information on federal tax credits.*

## **College Tuition Credit or Itemized Deduction**

The College Tuition Credit is a tax credit allowed for the qualified college tuition expenses paid for an eligible student. The credit is available to full-year New York state residents only. The college tuition itemized deduction is another option if you itemize your deductions on your tax return. *See publication IT-272 at [www.tax.ny.gov](http://www.tax.ny.gov) for more information.*



### Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)

The TAP helps eligible New York residents pay tuition at approved schools in the state. Depending on the academic year in which you begin study, an annual TAP award can be up to \$5,665. Because TAP is a grant, it does not have to be paid back. *Contact your school's financial aid office or visit [www.hesc.ny.gov](http://www.hesc.ny.gov) for more information.*

## Important Tax Information

In general, job-related educational assistance benefits are not taxable, with the following clarifications:

- Currently, no tax withholding is required on educational assistance benefits provided to employees up to a \$5,250 limit during the calendar year, except for Certification and Licensing Exam reimbursements which are always taxable.
- Educational assistance benefits that exceed \$5,250 may be taxable, unless they can be excluded as a "working condition fringe benefit."

These exemptions, however, can change from one tax year to another. **If educational assistance benefits from the Partnership alone or combined with tuition assistance from other NYS agencies exceed \$5,250, applicable income tax will be withheld from December paychecks.**

Please contact your accountant or tax advisor for guidance.

## School Codes

### *Undergraduate, Non-Credit, and Graduate*

You must list the provider's school code on your application form. This begins with a three-digit number followed by one or more letters—U, N, and G. Each letter represents a credit type, as outlined below. It is important to use the correct school code on your application form because some schools accept vouchers only for certain courses. Be sure to look closely at the provider directory in this catalog for details.

Courses are generally offered at BOCES or college continuing education departments. Non-credit courses do not award college credits, but sometimes award continuing education units (CEUs). | Accept vouchers for <b>graduate courses</b> . Most schools will not allow students to register for graduate courses unless they already possess a bachelor's degree. |

### *Tuition Reimbursement Program (TRP)*

If you're applying for tuition reimbursement for an accredited school or location that does not accept Partnership vouchers, or if you have already paid for a course and prefer to be reimbursed directly, use "TRP" as the school code on your application form.

- Eligible courses must be in session at some point between **April 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024.**
- All courses **must** be vocational, trade, technical, or business-related, and relevant to a NYS occupation or NYS workforce need. Types of non-credit courses not relevant to NYS workforce needs can be reviewed at the beginning of this catalog.
- Many providers offer basic skills courses in English, reading, writing, and math, or offer Adult Basic Education, high school equivalency, and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) courses. These courses are often free, but we can cover the course if tuition is charged.

## *How to Read School Codes*

You must list the provider's school code on your application form. This begins with a three-digit number followed by one to three letters—U, N, and G.
