Wide Selection of Courses and Learning Opportunities: SUNY Potsdam summer session boasts 140+ undergraduate and graduate courses throughout six different sessions, ranging from 3 to 12 weeks in length. Students can complete coursework within the traditional classroom, via video conferencing technology, or fully online, depending on the options available.

Others choose to utilize the summer months as a means to complete creditbearing internships, study abroad experiences, tutorials, practicums and/or independent study opportunities 1:1 with SUNY Potsdam faculty.

Accessible to All: We offer courses on Potsdam campus, at Jefferson Community College in Watertown, NY, and also online. We welcome and encourage matriculated and non-matriculated (visiting) students to take advantage of all we have to offer here in the North Country during this beautiful time of year.

About SUNY Potsdam: Founded in 1816 as the St. Lawrence Academy, the institution known today as The State University of New York at Potsdam is one of America's first 50 colleges. SUNY Potsdam is also the oldest institution in the SUNY system. APPLIED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Internships

SUNY Potsdam's Internship Program is an academic program whereby students work/intern at companies related to their academic majors. REGISTRATION & ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Matriculated Undergraduate and Graduate Students

Web registration begins on March 11, 2019. Specific registration dates and instructions are available on the <u>www.potsdam.edu/summer</u> website. Matriculated students register for summer courses within BearPAWS, the same way they do for coursework offered during fall and spring semesters.

Non-Matriculated/Non-Degree Enrollment

You do not have to be a SUNY Potsdam student to enroll in a course during summer. Apply to be a non-matriculated (visiting) student now, and be sure to indicate the course(s) you wish to enroll in during the application process: <u>www.potsdam.edu/nondegree</u>.

COST TO ATTEND

Affordable Tuition Rates

\$286 per undergraduate credit and \$462 per graduate credit for New York state residents. Additional student fees may apply and can be viewed at <u>www.potsdam.edu/admissions/tuition</u>. Tuition and fee charges are subject to change by the SUNY Board of Trustees.

Financial Aid

Available for qualified part-time and full-time SUNY Potsdam students. To secure summer financial aid, students must submit a separate aid application in addition to the FAFSA (<u>https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa</u>). Applications are reviewed both by the date an application is received in the Financial Aid Office, and by the date one begins enrollment. Please allow a minimum of two weeks to process your application. Be sure to review important Summer Aid Information regarding eligibility for specific funds, and the impact to your fall and/or spring aid if you use these funds in the summer.

Meal Options

There are no meal plans/packages available for students for summer session. Students may purchase food at open venues on campus using credit, debit or cash.

BILLING INFORMATION

Students who register for Summer Session will be charged tuition and fees (i.e. College Fee, Health Fee, Transcript Fee, etc.), prorated based upon total number of credits registered. Billing statements for Summer Session will be available in your BearPAWS account – paper bills will not be mailed. No deferments will be available.

Payments should be made online through your BearPAWS eBill link to our CASHNet ePayment portal. We accept Mastercard, Visa, Discover, American Express and ACH payments. Students who register for coursework during the open registration period (March 11th – May 22nd) must submit payment by June 12th. Students with prior semester balances over \$500 will forego Summer Session eligibility until their accounts have been reconciled.

A bill is considered unpaid at the close of business on June 12th, and the student may have registration cancelled at that time, with the exception of students who have pending financial aid application requests in process. Students who wish to register after May 23rd must pay in full at the Student Accounts Office, 412 Raymond Hall, prior to being registered. How To Drop A Summer Session Course

Matriculated SUNY Potsdam students may Web Drop their courses within BearPAWS through May 22, 2019. After this date, web registration will be turned off.

After the period of open registration has closed, course drop requests must be submitted in one of two ways:

- Email: gradcon@potsdam.edu and include the following details: your first and last name, Potsdam ID number, and the name and CRN of the course(s) you wish to drop.
- In Person: Visit us in 206 Raymond Hall to complete an Add/Drop form. We will then remove the course in question from your schedule. The Division of Graduate and Continuing Education will be open Monday through Friday during the summer months, from 8am to 4pm.
- If the office is not open at the time that you would like to drop your course, please email us at gradcon@potsdam.edu. Courses will be dropped effective the date and time of your email.
